Speeding reported in Seagrim (off Cheseldene Rd) lots of children play in this road. Residents have been reminded to slow down.</li> <li>2. <b>Parking.</b> There are issues with parking around Bradford Road and around the school during dropping off and collection time. Parents are parking dangerously on the corner of Bradford Road. Mandy to ask Enforcement to attend. Double yellow lines have been extended, and it has calmed down</li> <li>3. <b>Cold Calling – there ahs been an increase in cold calling in the area from a company called Kinson roofing. Damian to put something together and e-mail out, so we can distribute to residents via Cllrs news letter etc.</b></li> <li>4. <b>Reports of ASB over the summer period at the Arboretum. Reports of young people drinking, having camp fires and sleeping in this area. Appear to be young people from Southbourne</b></li> </ol>

Need to get residents on board. Still waiting, won't hear anything till the New Year.</li> <li>2. <b>Hicks farm/Throop mill. Peoples millions have awarded the area to put in a crossing at Church Lane. Hurn Parish council objecting to the proposal. Trying to keep the mill as it is with all the equipment.</b> Hurn still objecting as they think will bring ASB. Been delayed, rights of way have been overturned. Pigs shoot is probable route, slow progress but back on the agenda. Trying to make contact with the mill. Crossing has now been agreed for the pig shoot</li> <li>3. <b>Playbuliders. To enhance the play facilities in Muscliff. Muscliff Park and Setley Gardens have been identified.</b> Consultation for Setley will be on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> June 7-9pm. The consultation was difficult, residents do not want anything here but young people do. Hoping work will start here before Xmas Young</li> </ol>

To start Jan/Feb time, there will be equipment for all ages.</p> <p>4. <b>Dirt Jumps in the park near the youth Club.</b> Young people have requested dirt jumps in the park. Young people are digging up areas to do this already. Janey is working on this. Has a meeting planned to go through the risk assessment? All the money is in place will keep us informed. Residents have commented that it looks 'ugly' and concerns over bikes coming onto the pavement off the jump. These concerns will be looked at and addressed.</p> <p>5. <b>Yellow Lines</b> – there is a small area on Chesledene Road that has no yellow lines and it is on a blind bend. Cars and vans park in this area and reduces visibility making it dangerous. A meeting is to be arranged to discuss this area and see if this area can also have yellow lines.</p> <p>6. <b>Gillian expressed concerns around the area between the two buildings.</b> This area floods in heavy rainfall can this area be looked at and re-designed? Cllrs agreed this needs to be looked at and would contact park department and see what can be done.</p>
