PRIORITY UPDATE

Actions on the previous community priorities

Anti-social behaviour outside One Stop, Jewell Road

Safer Neighbourhood Officers have been conducting high visibility patrols in the vicinity of the One Stop shop, moving on anyone behaving in an antisocial manner and seizing alcohol from anyone under the age of 18.

Officers have also been working to help the shop's management to prevent proxy purchases - when a person over the age of 18 purchases alcohol on behalf of someone under the age of 18, which is a criminal offence.

Mopeds & mini-motos being driven anti-socially, Jewell Road and adjoining roads

Information from residents has enabled the Safer Neighbourhood Team to identify the alleged offenders, who have now been spoken to and warned of the potential consequences of committing anti-social behaviour.

Officers appealed to residents - via Virtual Home Watch and public meetings - for information about a bike that was of interest to the police. As a result of the appeal, the offending bike was located by the SNT.

The Townsend Safer Neighbourhood Team encourages residents to report further incidents to them to ensure the issue doesn't reoccur.

Speeding on Woodbury Road, Hastings Road and **Jewell Road**

Trained Safer Neighbourhood Officers have been using a speed oun on roads in the area, where it is perceived there are issues with speeding vehicles, in a bid to catch motorists breaking the speed limit.

The team will continue to carry out regular speed checks in these areas for as long as there are reports of speeding vehicles.

Virtual Home Watch

Townsend Safer Neighbourhood Team is urging residents to join one of two Home Watch schemes which operate in the area.

Residents can chose between a traditional Home Watch and a virtual one, both of which aim to make the area even safer.

Traditionally, Home Watch operates through regular community meetings. However, those residents who are unable to attend the meetings can receive and reply to messages containing crime prevention advice and upto-date crime information, by email, phone or text, through virtual Home Watch.

Virtual Home Watch was set up in 2004 by the Townsend Safer Neighbourhood Team and the Townsend Together Team - made up of residents and agencies working in the community. It has 576 members to date.

Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) Majid Samadi, of the Townsend Safer Neighbourhood Team, said: "Home Watch schemes allow for effective two-way communication between Dorset Police and the community we serve.

Unlike the traditional Home Watch scheme, membership of virtual Home Watch is known only to the police.

Thanks to funding from the Townsend Together Team, signs advertising the virtual Home Watch scheme have been put up around the Townsend area - so it is now even easier to find out how to join either scheme.

Firearms awareness

evening

Back in November 2008 the Townsend Safer Neighbourhood Team organised an event aimed at raising young people's awareness of the potential consequences of carrying an imitation firearm.

Officers from Dorset Police's Firearms Unit were invited to give a presentation to youngsters at Townsend Youth Centre. The presentation included a short film telling the story of a group of young people who play with a BB gun - with disastrous consequences.

Officers finished their presentation by holding up a real, but de-activated, firearm and an imitation firearm for the young people to view – highlighting to them just how difficult it is to distinguish between the two.

Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) Majid Samadi, of the Townsend Safer Neighbourhood Team, said: "The presentation was designed to give young people the practical information they need to make smart choices that will keep them and their friends safe.

"I would urge youngsters against carrying any kind of replica weapon in a public place as this is against the law."
